We recognise that to achieve our purpose and vision we must take a proactive, strategic approach to energy management and strive to be ambitious in doing so. This facilitated by an Environmental and Energy Management System (EEMS) that enables strategic management and public reporting of our ESG performance.

Our business activities have substantial impacts on the natural and built environment at all stages of the property cycle. We therefore commit to using best practice in the design and operation of our assets to minimise energy demand in the short-, medium- and long-term, and procure energy in the most responsible way possible.

We recognise our influence on the energy performance of others and commit to engaging with stakeholders to drive improvements in energy efficiency across our value chain. This is set out in our complementary Responsible Procurement Policy.

We comply with, and strive to go beyond, relevant energy legislation and compliance obligations. Through clear objectives and target setting and conducting regular and independent reviews of our progress, we aim to achieve continual improvement in energy efficiency and our wider environmental performance. This is facilitated by our ESG strategy, Sustainability Linked Bond targets and Net Zero 2030 targets.

Hammerson will continue to drive improvement in energy efficiency by completing audits and reviews of compliance with our environmental and energy management system, continue to invest in renewable energy production, where possible, and explore innovative routes to energy efficiency. We will continue to work with stakeholders to reduce areas of significant energy use across the portfolio.

All colleagues, contractors and stakeholders have a part to play if Hammerson is to meet its energy objectives. To achieve this, we commit that the information and resources needed to achieve our energy targets will be available to the business.
