## Responsible Procurement Policy

Our purpose is to create outstanding experiences in unique city locations. This is underpinned by our vision of having exceptional destinations that connect communities, delivering a positive impact for generations to come.

We recognise that to achieve our purpose and vision we must take a proactive, strategic approach to responsible procurement principles and strive to be ambitious in doing so. This is facilitated by an Environmental and Energy Management System ('EEMS') that enables the strategic management and public reporting of our ESG performance.

We are a major procurer of goods and services, and recognise the importance of addressing the environmental, social and governance risks inherent in the supply chain.

Hammerson delivers responsible procurement by prioritising:

- The procurement of environmentally and socially sustainable goods and materials
- Engagement with ESG focused suppliers to encourage better performance and management of risks in our supply chain
- Only purchasing utilities from responsible providers able to demonstrate their commitment to ESG and renewable sources, where available
- The inclusion of energy efficiency and performance ratings when selecting products, equipment, and services

We commit to working in partnership with key suppliers to raise awareness of supply chain sustainability issues and support them in minimising the impacts of their activities.

We comply with all relevant ESG legislation and regulatory requirements, including the Modern Slavery Act and report against our progress annually.

All employees, suppliers and contractors have a part to play in enabling us to meet environmental, energy and social sustainability objectives. This is achieved through adherence to our Procurement Policy and a requirement for all relevant suppliers to agree to our Supplier Code of Conduct.

This policy was approved by the Hammerson plc Board on 1 May 2025 and has been signed on its behalf below. Responsibility for the implementation of this policy lies with the Group Executive Committee, which is also tasked with periodically reviewing the Group's ESG performance to ensure applicability and adherence to best practice. Responsibility for overseeing this policy and ensuring it is upheld lies with Rita-Rose Gagné, our Chief Executive Officer.
